It is with great sadness that we acknowledge the passing of Mr. Carl Lamm.

Carl was the impetus, heart and drive behind starting the "Helpers Fund" in Chestertown. It is an organization that has existed for more than 25 years and exists only because of Carl's caring and concern for others.

He will be missed.

Beginning in 2023 there will be an annual scholarship awarded to one student who has demonstrated an interest in, and commitment to, community improvement. This scholarship will be named "The Carl Lamm Memorial Scholarship".

General Information

This past year the Fund has continued to fulfill its mission of providing assistance to those members of the community who find themselves needing a helping hand. We have provided various forms of support to people living in the communities of Chestertown, Brant Lake and

Pottersville while adding medical and dental assistance to those qualified individuals in Schroon Lake.

Our greatest concern for the coming winter is the potential for increased requests for heating fuel and heating hardware support. With inflation running at 40 year highs we have concern about the very high cost for heating fuel this year. With HEAP generally being given only once each heating season, the Fund may be called on to assist people at a higher level than in previous years.

During the past six months we have provided assistance in the following areas:

General Assistance

- Provided funds for the repair of an elderly woman's furnace who required the repairs to safely operate her furnace during this coming heating season.
- We continue our "partnership" with Hudson Headwaters Health Network by providing financial assistance to a number of individuals and families for medical visits, dental procedures, prescription copays and medically necessary materials. This assistance was provided to people in Chestertown, Pottersville, Brant Lake and Schroon Lake.
- Provided and repaired steps to a home to improve safety

What we've been up to!

Fall 2022

- when entering and leaving the home.
- Continued our support of High Peaks Hospice to cover expenses incurred, and not reimbursed, by individuals in Chestertown, Pottersville and Brant Lake.

Food Pantry

- More than 30 families from Chestertown and Pottersville have participated in the Food Pantry since our last newsletter.
- Continued our purchase of fresh meat for distribution at semi-monthly food pantries.
- Shared over \$2500 in TOPS cards. These cards are used for the purchase of food and household goods not provided in the food pantry. This includes items such as dairy, produce and personal healthcare items.
- Continued our support and sponsorship of the North Warren CSD Backpack Program with a donation in excess of \$5000.
- Distributed more than \$900 of vouchers that were used at the Chestertown Farmers Market to purchase fresh vegetables and fruit.

This overview covers some of the actions taken in support of a number of our neediest neighbors since our last report.

It should be noted that by year end 2022, The Helpers Fund will have expended more than \$53,000 to support the neediest in our community!
